## Third Sunday of Advent

December 12<sup>th</sup>, 2021

### Rejoice

The third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday, as Gaudete is the Latin word meaning, "rejoice." The third candle in the Advent wreath is the color rose, which represents joy.

Today's readings are filled with the theme of rejoicing. In today's first reading, the Israelites are encouraged to rejoice as a saviour is promised to Israel. The Psalm's refrain is 'Shout aloud and sing for joy: great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel'. In the second reading, Paul tells the Philippians to rejoice always as the Lord is near.

In the Gospel, the people were filled with expectation and wondering if John the Baptist is the expected Messiah. John the Baptist states that one more powerful than he is coming and he proclaimed the good news to the people.

Advent is a time of joyful expectation and eager preparation for the Solemnity of Christmas. There is joy in awaiting the birth of our Saviour Jesus Christ.

We rejoice at the new life being offered through Jesus. We trust and find hope in the promises God has made to us. We rejoice because of our faith in him.

Advent is a chance to focus on the gift God has given us in his son Jesus. This is a time for us to rejoice because Jesus came and died so that we may live forever with him.

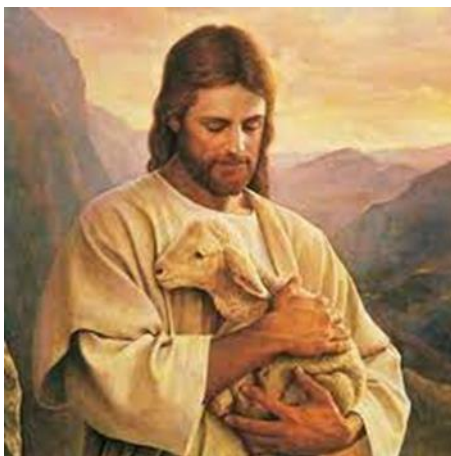

### Government of Manitoba Pandemic Directives Effective October 26, 2021

Under current health orders, our maximum limit with physical distancing in church is approximately 80 people. The limit for weddings, baptisms, funerals and prayer vigils for the deceased is 25 people.

Please note that by decision of the Archdiocese, parishes will not require the faithful to present proof of vaccination.

As you all know COVID-19 has not disappeared. Even if you have been "Double Vacc'd" you can still contract the COVID-19 virus, usually with less severity. Or you can be "A-Symptomatic" and not even know that you carry the COVID-19 Virus.

Just a reminder to keep on following the protocols as so many of you have been doing so faithfully and patiently. As much as we are all tired, it is critical that we continue to follow and respect all public health protocols that are in place:

1. Ensuring that we maintain six feet apart social distancing.
2. The sanitizing of hands.
3. Mandatory mask wearing.
4. When you process for Holy Communion, please ensure that you maintain a six-foot distance between the person in front and the person behind you.
5. We ask that after Mass no one is to congregate in the church or in the gathering space for any length of time.
6. If you experience flu like symptoms or are not feeling well in a general matter, we ask that you refrain from coming to Mass, as there are many options of following the Sunday Mass on TV or You Tube.
7. Do not hesitate to get tested for COVID-19, as the virus can present mild symptoms in vaccinated people.

If you would like to attend a weekend Mass, please call or email the office the week prior to book a space. We still need to have a list of names and numbers of all those attending for the purpose of contact tracing.
