1st Sunday of Lent

February 21, 2021

40 Days

The Gospel reading for the first Sunday of Lent is always the story of Jesus being led by the Spirit into the desert for 40 days.

The number 40 appears many times in the Bible, including the flood in Genesis, Moses' time on Mt. Sinai and the Israelites wondering through the desert. When we see the number 40 in the bible, it represents a period of time where there are usually trials, something significant happens and change occurs.

Lent is a 40-day season of preparation to celebrate the Easter season. It is about growing closer to God and letting him transform us. Lent is about conversion.

The practices of Lent are to help with this conversion, which is lifelong. We are called to deepen our spiritual lives through the practices of fasting, prayer and almsgiving.

Giving up something for Lent can be a great way to practice discipline, and focus our needs away from the physical to the spiritual. However, Lent is not just about giving things up. We can also add things into our lives. Perhaps we read the Bible more or spend more time praying as a family

Since there are only so many hours in a day, in order to do more we may have to do certain things less. Lent asks us to focus more on the things that help grow us closer to God and focus less on the things that take us further away from him.

Whatever practices we choose to focus on this Lent, let us not forget that they are to help change us in a way that will last once the 40 days are over.

COVID-19 Restrictions Update Effective February 12, 2021

New Code Red Alert restrictions for all of Manitoba will come into effect on February 12, 2021.

Please be advised that places of worship can hold regular religious services, if such a service does not exceed 10 per cent of usual capacity, or 50 people, whichever is lower. For Holy Redeemer Parish, this will mean that 35 people are allowed at each Mass.

Baptisms, marriages and funerals are capped at a ten-person maximum, excluding celebrant, lector, cantor, musician and parish staff/funeral home personnel.

If you would like to attend a weekend Mass, please contact the office no later than noon on Friday to add your name to the list of participants. If you have signed up but are unable to attend please contact the office before noon Friday.



Mass Information During Time of Pandemic PLEASE

Due to the most recent restrictions due to Code Red:

- Only **35** people are allowed at each Mass. The doors of the church will be locked at the beginning of Mass.
- Two-meter physical distancing is **obligatory** in the church, gathering space and parking lot.
- When being seated kindly sit **singly** at the pre-measured number signs. If you notice 2 numbered signs together, please leave it for couples.
- Masks are obligatory (if you cannot wear a mask for medical reasons please see Sister Maria).
- Please arrive at least 5 – 10 minutes before Mass. This is to ensure that the Greeter can check you in by the time Mass begins. Doors will be locked once Mass begins.
- If you would like to attend a weekend Mass, please contact the office no later than noon on Friday to add your name to the list of participants. If you have signed up but are unable to attend please contact the office before noon Friday.
- There is no need to sign up beforehand for the weekday Masses; however, participants will have to sign their name to a list upon arrival.
- For the purpose of contact tracing, if ever needed, please add your **phone number** next to your name.
