Personal Prayer

This liturgical year, Year B, we are reading from the Gospel of Mark. It is short and action packed. It starts with John the Baptist preaching, then the Baptism of Jesus, call of the first disciples, the beginning of Jesus's ministry where we see Jesus teaching, driving out demons and healing, and that's all in the first chapter.

In the middle of all this action, *'Jesus got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed'*. (Mark 1:35). Jesus makes time to go away by himself to a quiet spot to be alone with God the Father in prayer.

Just as Jesus went to a quiet spot to pray, we too must choose to go to a quiet spot, free of distractions, to pray and focus fully on God. Our lives can get so busy at times, that we can lose sight of who God made us to be.

God made us to know, love and serve him. In order to get to know God we need to spend time with him. Consciously making time for God is essential for living our lives as Christians.

To grow and nourish our faith we need to make time for personal prayer, just as Jesus did. Prayer allows us to grow into a deeper relationship with our Lord. In quiet conversation with God, we discern what God is saying to us and where he is leading us.

We may not always get the answer we want or on the time frame most convenient for us, but we are called to trust and have faith that God knows what is best.
