"Love is patient, love is kind;
love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude.

It does not insist on its own way;

In today's second reading, we hear the well known Bible verse about love. Love can be a hard word to define, but in this reading, we see examples of what it is and looks like.


We are called to love. This passage calls us to reflect on how loving we are in our lives. Am I patient and kind, or am I arrogant and rude? Maybe it depends on the situation, but we are called to consistently love.

We are called to love everyone. We are called not just to love our family and friends, but strangers and our enemies. We are called not just to love those we agree with, but those we disagree with as well.

We need to remember that everyone we encounter is a child of God. Jesus died for each and everyone of us and loves us all. We are called to love as God loved and to never forget to see the humanity in one another

Once collected, parishioner responses will be summarized by the Pastoral Council and Fr. Anthony. The summaries will then be submitted to the Diocese for further processing. Each diocese will submit a synthesis of the conversations that take place, which will nourish the conversations that will take place at the next Synod of Bishops in October 2023.



Government of Manitoba Pandemic Directives Cohorts Effective January 29, 2022

Indoor faith-based gatherings are limited to 25% capacity or 25 people, whichever is lesser. This restriction may be increased to 25% capacity of the space to a maximum of 250 people, by separating attendees into cohorts of 25 people each.

For our parish, we are allowed to have two separate cohorts. The cohorts must not mingle and will be using separate entrances and exits.

Cohort 1 is seated in the right side of the church and uses the main doors of the church to enter and exit.

Cohort 2 is seated in the left side of the church and uses the southeast back door to enter and exit. Please note that this door will be locked once Mass begins. Please use the main doors if you arrive after Mass begins.

Weddings, funerals and baptisms are limited to 25 people.

Please note that by decision of the Archdiocese, parishes will not require the faithful to present proof of vaccination.

Just a reminder to keep on following the protocols as so many of you have been doing so faithfully and patiently. If you would like to attend a weekend Mass, please call or email the office the Friday the week prior to book a space. We still need to have a list of names and numbers of all those attending for the purpose of contact tracing. Thank you.
