Most Holy Trinity

June 12th, 2022

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, the central mystery of the Christian faith. The Holy Trinity; three distinct persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature.

There is a legend about St. Augustine and the child by the seaside. The story states that St. Augustine was walking by the seashore one day contemplating the mystery of the Holy Trinity when he saw a little child running back and forth from the water to a spot on the seashore.

The boy was using a shell to carry water from the large ocean and pour it into a small pit that he had made in the sand. Augustine watched him for a while and asked the child what he was doing.

The child answered that he would scoop all the water from the sea and pour it into the little hole in the sand. 'What?' Augustine said. 'That is impossible. Obviously, the sea is too large and the hole too small.'

"That is true," the boy said. "It would be easier and quicker to draw all the water out of the sea and fit it into this hole than for you to fit the mystery of the Trinity and His Divinity into your little intellect; for the Mystery of the Trinity is greater and larger in comparison with your intelligence than is this vast ocean in comparison with this little hole." And then the child vanished.

Some say the boy was actually an angel sent by God, while others say it was Jesus himself. Whether this story is true or not, it represents how as human beings we will never fully understand the mystery of the Trinity.

In his Angelus address on May 30, 2021, Pope Francis stated that *"This mystery of the Trinity was revealed to us by Jesus himself. He showed us the face of God as a merciful Father; he presented himself, true man, as the Son of God and Word of the Father; he spoke of the Holy Spirit who proceeds from the Father and the Son, the Spirit of Truth."*

Trinity Sunday makes us contemplate this wonderful mystery and poses an invitation to grow in the unity to which Jesus calls us. And this unity I dare to say is essential to the Christian ... because it is the unity that is born from love, from the mercy of God, from the justification of Jesus Christ and from the presence of the Holy Spirit in our heart."

Parish Perogy Fundraiser Being Planned For September 2022

The making and selling of perogies has been an excellent fundraiser and community builder for our parish in the past and we are planning towards having the first perogy fundraiser in over two years in September 2022. However, in order for this fundraiser to take place we need volunteers.

The making and selling of perogies are spread over two days:

Monday 8 a.m. to approx. 2 p.m.:

At least 20 volunteers are needed and tasks include peeling potatoes; making dough balls; setting up tables and cleaning up. Coffee and snacks will be provided.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to approx. 4 p.m.:

At least 35 volunteers are needed and tasks include rolling dough; pinching perogies; packaging, filling and selling orders and cleaning up. Lunch will be provided.

At this time, we do not know the exact date in September, but we are asking those who are interested in helping to put their names on the sign up sheet on the counter in the gathering space.
