Body and Blood of Christ

June 19th, 2022

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is celebrated every year on the Second Sunday after Pentecost. The traditional name for the feast is Corpus Christi (Latin for Body of Christ). We celebrate Christ's gift of the Eucharist: the Real Presence of Jesus Christ - Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity.

In today's Gospel reading we hear Jesus feeding the five thousand people. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that *"the miracles of the multiplication of the loaves, when the Lord says the blessing, breaks and distributes the loaves through his disciples to feed the multitude, prefigure the superabundance of this unique bread of his Eucharist"* (CCC 1335). *"All who eat the one broken bread, Christ, enter into communion with him and form but one body in him"* (CCC 1329).

The Second Vatican Council describes the Eucharist as *"the source and summit of the Christian life"*. Why did Jesus give us the Eucharist? Because he loves us. By consuming Jesus, we become united to him. *"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him"* (John 6:56).

In his Angelus prayer on June 23, 2019, Pope Francis stated, *"The Eucharist is the culmination of Jesus' entire life, which was a single act of love toward the Father and brothers and sisters. The feast of Corpus Christi invites us to renew each year the wonder and joy of this wondrous gift of the Lord, which is the Eucharist."*

Let us receive it with gratitude, not in a passive, habitual way. We should not grow accustomed to the Eucharist and go to Communion as a habit: no! Each time we approach the altar to receive the Eucharist, we must truly renew our "amen" to the Body of Christ. When the priest says "the Body of Christ", we say "amen": but let it be an "amen" that comes from the heart, a committed one. It is Jesus; it is Jesus who saved me; it is Jesus who comes to give me the strength to live. It is Jesus, the living Jesus."

Parish Perogy Fundraiser Being Planned For September 2022

The making and selling of perogies has been an excellent fundraiser and community builder for our parish in the past and we are planning towards having the first perogy fundraiser in over two years in September 2022. However, in order for this fundraiser to take place we need volunteers.

The making and selling of perogies are spread over two days:
Monday 8 a.m. to approx. 2 p.m.:

At least 20 volunteers are needed and tasks include peeling potatoes; making dough balls; setting up tables and cleaning up. Coffee and snacks will be provided.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to approx. 4 p.m.:

At least 35 volunteers are needed and tasks include rolling dough; pinching perogies; packaging, filling and selling orders and cleaning up. Lunch will be provided.

All are welcome, even if you can only spare a few hours, and training will be provided. At this time, we do not know the exact date in September, but we are asking those who are interested in helping to put their names on the sign up sheet on the counter in the gathering space. Please note that becoming a candidate is a first official recognition of the positive signs of a vocation to the diaconate, which must be confirmed in the years following formation.


