Trust in Him

Today's Gospel reading is about Jesus calming the storm. When the Apostles boat was submerging because of the windstorm, they woke Jesus up and said to him *"Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?"*

Just like the Apostles, we may wonder where God is when we encounter difficulties in our lives or see suffering and evil in this world. Why does he allow bad things to happen?

God created us to know and love him and to be with him in eternal life. However, to be able to truly love we must be free to choose to do so, otherwise we are simply robots. 
