Discipleship

In today's Gospel, we hear about what it means to be a disciple of Jesus.

As a disciple, we must make a conscious choice to live a life for Christ. No one can make that decision for us. While others may teach and make Jesus known to us, the decision to follow him is ours alone.

As a disciple, we are called to live a life for Jesus continuously. Being a Christian is not just about going to church once a week, it is a way of life. How we live our lives during the week must match what we proclaim on Sundays. As disciples, we do not give Jesus just a bit of ourselves, but our whole self.

As disciples, our daily actions flow from the love of Jesus we have within us. We are called to love, for everyone we encounter is a child of God. When we proclaim the truth of Jesus, we must do so out of love.

As a disciple, we continuously grow in our relationship with Jesus. He loves us and wants what is best for us. We are called to consistently speak to him and listen to him speak to us, and live our lives how he is calling us to, even when it is difficult.

In his homily on the Feast of St. Peter and Paul on June 29, 2017, Pope Francis stated the following:

"Let us ask ourselves if we are parlour Christians, who love to chat about how things are going in the Church and the world, or apostles on the go, who confess Jesus with their lives because they hold him in their hearts."

Those who confess Jesus know that they are not simply to offer opinions but to offer their very lives. They know that they are not to believe half-heartedly but to "be on fire" with love. They know that they cannot just "tread water" or take the easy way out, but have to risk putting out into the deep, daily renewing their self-offering.

Those who confess their faith in Jesus do as Peter and Paul did: they follow him to the end – not just part of the way, but to the very end. They also follow the Lord along his way, not our own ways. His way is that of new life, of joy and resurrection; it is also the way that passes through the cross and persecution."

Parish Perogy Fundraiser Being Planned For September 2022

The making and selling of perogies has been an excellent fundraiser and community builder for our parish in the past and we are planning towards having the first perogy fundraiser in over two years in September 2022. However, in order for this fundraiser to take place we need volunteers.

The making and selling of perogies are spread over two days:

Monday 8 a.m. to approx. 2 p.m.:

At least 20 volunteers are needed and tasks include peeling potatoes; making dough balls; setting up tables and cleaning up. Coffee and snacks will be provided.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to approx. 4 p.m.:

At least 35 volunteers are needed and tasks include rolling dough; pinching perogies; packaging, filling and selling orders and cleaning up. Lunch will be provided.

All are welcome, even if you can only spare a few hours, and training will be provided. At this time, we do not know the exact date in September, but we are asking those who are interested in helping to put their names on the sign up sheet on the counter in the gathering space.
