Have Faith in Jesus

In today's Gospel, we read of Jesus healing two individuals: a young child on the point of death and a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years.

In both of these cases Jesus is approached to heal the ill. In the first case by the child's father and in the second by the woman herself. Both had faith that Jesus could heal the afflicted. Jesus responded to their pleas and healed both the child and the woman.

When we face difficulties in our lives we are called to follow the examples of the two individuals in today's Gospel and bring our sufferings to Jesus.

While Jesus healed the two individuals quickly in today's Gospel, we may not receive immediate relief from our sufferings. This does not mean that Jesus did not hear us or that he is ignoring us, he is responding in his own way and time.

*For my thoughts are not your thoughts,
neither are your ways my ways, says the LORD.
For as the heavens are higher than the earth,
so are my ways higher than your ways
and my thoughts than your thoughts.*

Isaiah 55:8-9

We have to remind ourselves that God is in control. As we journey through life, things may not always turn out the way we want. However we know that we do not journey alone, Jesus is there with us. Let him know your concerns, doubts and trials.

While we may not always get the answer we want in the timeframe we want, we are asked to have faith in Jesus and to trust that he will do what is best.

Bishops' Statement: Delegation to the Holy See

On June 10, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) published a second statement following the report of a recent discovery of children's graves at the former Kamloops Indian Residential School on the Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc First Nation.

"In conversation with Indigenous people and communities, both at the local and national levels, and bilaterally with the First Nations, Métis and Inuit national organizations, the Bishops, sponsors of this project, have been preparing, for over two years now, a delegation of Indigenous people to meet with the Holy Father to foster meaningful encounters of dialogue and healing."

COVID-19 Restrictions Update

A new set of public health orders will take effect on Saturday, June 26 at 12:01 a.m. and will be in effect until Monday, August 2 at 12:01 a.m.

Indoor faith-based services can resume at 25 per cent capacity to a limit of 25 persons with masks worn at all times, and with physical distancing measures in place.

For Holy Redeemer Parish this means that we can have a maximum of 25 people attending each Mass. Please note that the liturgical team (presider, parish life director, server, cantor, etc.) are not counted as part of the 25 person limit.

Indoor weddings, funerals and baptisms remain limited to 10 persons.

Dr. Roussin reminds Manitobans that "while the case numbers and our health system are improving, the pandemic is not over and variants of concern, especially the B.1.617.2 (delta) variant, are still circulating. This is why Manitobans need to continue to practice the fundamentals – washing your hands, physical distancing, wearing a mask, and getting fully vaccinated."

Mass Information During Time of Pandemic PLEASE

Due to the most recent restrictions due to Code Red:

1. Only **25** people are allowed at each Mass. The doors of the church will be locked at the beginning of Mass.
2. Two-meter physical distancing is **obligatory** in the church, gathering space and parking lot.
3. When being seated kindly sit **singly** at the pre-measured number signs. If you notice 2 numbered signs together, please leave it for couples.
4. Masks are obligatory (if you cannot wear a mask for medical reasons please see Sister Maria).
5. Please arrive at least 5 – 10 minutes before Mass. This is to ensure that the Greeter can check you in by the time Mass begins. Doors will be locked once Mass begins.
6. If you would like to attend a weekend Mass, please call or email the office the week prior to book a space. Bookings will take place on a first come, first served basis.
7. For the purpose of contact tracing, if ever needed, please add your **phone number** next to your name.
