Feast of Corpus Christi

June 6, 2021

Body and Blood of Christ

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi, is celebrated on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday. This feast focuses on the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

Like the Most Holy Trinity, the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is a mystery that cannot be fully comprehended by our human limitations.

During the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass, the bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit. Even though they still look and taste like bread and wine, their substance has changed into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ.

Jesus instituted the Eucharist at the Last Supper, and belief in the Real Presence has existed since the early Church.

Jesus gave us the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment. As Christians, we are called to be in communion with the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Our sharing in this life begins at Baptism, is strengthened at Confirmation and is nourished by the Eucharist.

“The Body and Blood of Christ are given to us so that we ourselves will be transformed in our turn. We are to become the Body of Christ, his own Flesh and Blood.”

We all eat the one bread, and this means that we ourselves become one. God no longer simply stands before us as the One who is totally Other. He is within us, and we are in him. His dynamic enters into us and then seeks to spread outwards to others until it fills the world, so that his love can truly become the dominant measure of the world.”

5. Parishioners may donate through the Archdiocesan website using your credit card (not the preferred method as there is a 3% fee that our parish incurs).

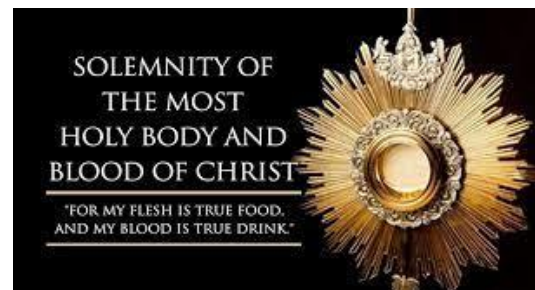
