A Season of Conversion

Pope Francis describes Lent as a “journey of spiritual renewal in the footsteps of Christ.” It is a season of conversion, not just for those who are preparing to be baptized and enter the church at the Easter Vigil, but for all of us.

Conversion is saying yes to Jesus’ invitation to be his disciple. Saying yes to Jesus is not a one-time decision, but one we must decide to make throughout our whole lives.

In today’s Psalm we hear the words:

“Lord you have the words of eternal life.”

(Psalm 19)

These words are also heard in the Bread of Life discourse in the Gospel of John. During this discourse, Jesus proclaims some difficult teachings and as a result, many people stop following him.

Jesus then turns to the Apostles and asks if they will also leave. Peter answers:

“Lord to whom would we go? You have the words of eternal life. And now we believe and know that you are the Holy One who has come from God.

(John 6:68-69).

At Easter, we will renew our Baptismal promises. We make the conscious decision to renounce Satan and proclaim our belief in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Not a belief that they merely exist, but a belief more than that.

It is a belief that God the Father is real. That he loves us and wants what is best for us. A belief that he sent his only beloved Son to save us, a belief that he speaks to us and works in our lives through the Holy Spirit. It is a belief that our Lord truly does have the words of eternal life.

COVID-19 Restrictions Update Effective March 5, 2021

On March 2, 2021, the Government of Manitoba released new public health orders effective March 5th, 2021 at 12:01 a.m. and will expire on March 25th, 2021:

“Places of worship to have increased capacity size of 25 percent or 100 people, whichever is lower, with physical distancing measures in place and mask requirements.”

For Holy Redeemer parish, this means that we can have a maximum of 77 people attending each Mass, including priest, etc.
