The Vine and the Branches

In today's Gospel, we hear the parable of the vine and the branches. Jesus is the vine and his disciples are the branches. The branches are called to bear fruit, but cannot do so apart from the vine.

Jesus is saying these words to his disciples on the evening before his crucifixion. These first disciples would be witnesses to his death, resurrection and ascension into heaven.

The disciples did not keep what they had experienced to themselves. The regular witness of their lives, their teaching, and their love of God and others led to conversions and growth of the early church. Just as Jesus instructed, they continued to carry out his mission on earth.

Our faith is to be one of action, not just words. We are called to bear fruit through living a life of faith, by keeping Jesus' commandments, loving and serving others, and carrying out the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

However, we cannot do this alone; we need to be rooted in Jesus Christ. As the vine, Jesus nourishes and supports us so we can be transformed and carry out his mission.

Through the vine and the branches parable, Jesus is teaching that there is a fruitful mutual union between himself and his disciples.

COVID-19 Restrictions Update Effective April 28, 2021

On April 28, the provincial government extended its Code Red Alert for all of Manitoba until at least May 26, but with a tightening of some restrictions.

With these new restrictions, regular religious services are limited to 25% capacity or 10 people, whichever is lower, with physical distancing measures in place. Masks must be worn at all times, including the liturgical team.

For Holy Redeemer parish, this means that we can have a maximum of 10 people attending each Mass. Please note that the liturgical team (presider, parish life director, server, cantor, etc.) are not counted as part of the 10-person limit, however we have been asked to downsize our liturgical team. Also, the staff in their offices are also not counted as part of the 10.

The limit for weddings, baptisms, and funerals remain unchanged at 10 people in addition to an officiant, photographer, funeral director, etc.

If you would like to attend a weekday or weekend Mass, please call the office the week prior to book a space. Bookings will take place on a first come, first served basis.

National March for Life & The National Mass for Life May 13, 2021

This year the March for Life will once again be taking place virtually, with complete live coverage through EWTN on Thursday, May 13th from 10:30 am – 1:30 pm CST.

The National March for Life in Ottawa, typically the largest annual protest on Parliament Hill, takes place in May to mark the passing of the 1969 omnibus bill which decriminalized abortion. Pro-lifers rally in front of our Parliament building and march through downtown Ottawa to advocate for the right to life of every human being from conception to natural death. Many provinces including Manitoba, have also held local marches in solidarity with Ottawa.

The National Mass for Life celebrated by Archbishop Dampousse, with greetings from Cardinal Collins and Archbishop Lépine from Notre Dame Cathedral in Ottawa, will be broadcast prior to the March on May 13th at 9:30 am CST.

Regional Masses for Life are being filmed from coast to coast and will run on MarchForLife.ca, including a Winnipeg Tri-Diocesan Mass on May 10.

Mass Information During Time of Pandemic PLEASE

Due to the most recent restrictions due to Code Red:

1. Only **10** people are allowed at each Mass. The doors of the church will be locked at the beginning of Mass.
2. Two-meter physical distancing is **obligatory** in the church, gathering space and parking lot.
3. When being seated kindly sit **singly** at the pre-measured number signs. If you notice 2 numbered signs together, please leave it for couples.
4. Masks are obligatory (if you cannot wear a mask for medical reasons please see Sister Maria).
5. Please arrive at least 5 – 10 minutes before Mass. This is to ensure that the Greeter can check you in by the time Mass begins. Doors will be locked once Mass begins.
6. If you would like to attend a weekday or weekend Mass, please call the office the week prior to book a space. Bookings will take place on a first come, first served basis.
7. For the purpose of contact tracing, if ever needed, please add your **phone number** next to your name.
