
We are to trust in God and be faithful, as he will not desert us. In the end, whenever that may be, we know good triumphs over evil. God is the ultimate victor.



Government of Manitoba Updated Pandemic Directives Effective October 26, 2021

New provincial restrictions came into effect on October 26, 2021. There are no changes to the size of faith-based gatherings. The health orders permit indoor sizes for faith-based gatherings to 25 people or 33 percent capacity, whichever is greater. This means that our maximum limit with physical distancing in church remains at approximately 80 people.

New provincial restrictions came into effect on October 29. These limit weddings, baptisms, funerals and prayer vigils for the deceased to 25 people or 25 % of church capacity, whichever is lower, which for our church is 25 people.

Please note that by decision of the Archdiocese, parishes will not require the faithful to present proof of vaccination.

Masks must be worn in all indoor public places, including places of worship and physical distancing of two metres for everyone not living in the same household must be maintained.

If you would like to attend a weekend Mass, please call or email the office the week prior to book a space. We still need to have a list of names and numbers of all those attending for the purpose of contact tracing.
