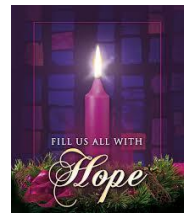

## First Sunday of Advent November 28<sup>th</sup>, 2021

### Hope



Today is the first Sunday of Advent and the beginning of a new liturgical year. While there are still restrictions due to COVID-19, this is the first time in two years we have been able to gather in person for Mass for Advent.

According to the General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar, Advent has a twofold character. It is a time of preparation for the Solemnity of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight.

In the Northern Hemisphere, Advent takes place during the darkest time of the year. Advent candles demonstrate the strong contrast between darkness and light. In this darkness, we await the Light of the World, Jesus Christ.

The Advent Wreath, shaped in the form of a circle and wrapped in evergreens, speaks of God's unending love for us, and of the equality of all peoples gathered around Jesus.

The four candles, pointing to the four directions of the world, speak to us: of Jesus coming to bring the light of his hope, peace, joy, and love to everyone; of the four thousand years the Jewish people waited for a Messiah; of our own four weeks of Advent waiting and longing.

As we light each candle, we pray that its increasing brightness speak to us of the approaching nearness of the birth of Emmanuel, God-with-us. This weekend we will light the first candle, which symbolizes hope, on the Advent wreath.

Hope is defined as a feeling of expectation and desire for a certain thing to happen: a feeling of trust. During Advent, we anticipate the Lord's coming with hope. This is a hope that encourages our faith in a merciful God who continues to pour his grace upon us. In hope, we know that real and lasting joy awaits in the Lord's promise of our salvation.

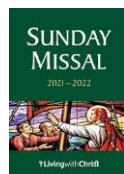
## **2022 Offering Envelopes Are Ready**

### Government of Manitoba Pandemic Directives Effective October 26, 2021

Under current health orders, our maximum limit with physical distancing in church is approximately 80 people. The limit for weddings, baptisms, funerals and prayer vigils for the deceased is 25 people.

Please note that by decision of the Archdiocese, parishes will not require the faithful to present proof of vaccination.

As you all know COVID-19 has not disappeared. Even if you have been "Double Vacc'd" you can still contract the COVID-19 virus, usually with less severity. Or you can be "A-Symptomatic" and not even know that you carry the COVID-19 Virus.

Just a reminder to keep on following the protocols as so many of you have been doing so faithfully and patiently. As much as we are all tired, it is critical that we continue to follow and respect all public health protocols that are in place:

1. Ensuring that we maintain six feet apart social distancing.
2. The sanitizing of hands.
3. Mandatory mask wearing.
4. When you process for Holy Communion, please ensure that you maintain a six-foot distance between the person in front and the person behind you.
5. We ask that after Mass no one is to congregate in the church for any length of time.
6. If you experience flu like symptoms or are not feeling well in a general matter, we ask that you refrain from coming to Mass, as there are many options of following the Sunday Mass on TV or YouTube.
7. Do not hesitate to get tested for COVID-19, as the virus can present mild symptoms in vaccinated people.

If you would like to attend a weekend Mass, please call or email the office the week prior to book a space. We still need to have a list of names and numbers of all those attending for the purpose of contact tracing. Thank you.
