### Happy Thanksgiving

#### Gratitude

Gratitude is central to the Gospel message. Thanksgiving Day presents us with the opportunity to reflect on our call to be eternally and deeply grateful. How grateful to God are we?

Perhaps we all struggle in various ways with gratitude. We will never be grateful unless we see clearly all that God has done for us. It is so easy in life to focus on all the struggles we face and, as a result, to get down, depressed, frustrated and even angry at times. If we fail to see how blessed we are, we will struggle with authentic gratitude. The failure to be truly grateful, to take as owed what is offered as gift, lies at the root of many of our deepest resentments towards others and their resentments towards us.

On this Thanksgiving weekend, let us reflect upon the call we all share...the call to be saints...the call to see as Mary did when she said in her Magnificat, "The Lord has done great things for me...". Gratitude is the ultimate virtue, under-girding everything, even love. It defines maturity. We are mature to the degree that we are grateful.

Ronald Rolheiser, OMI, suggests some major ways to become more grateful and mature:

- Be willing to be compassionate...to carry life's complexities with empathy...so that, like Jesus, we cry tears of understanding over our troubled world and complex hearts.
- Transform jealousy, anger, bitterness and hatred rather than give them back in kind.
- Let suffering soften rather than harden our souls.
- Forgive...forgive those who have hurt us, forgive ourselves for our own shortcomings, and forgive God for seeming to have forsaken us in troubled times.

The source of strength for gratitude and forgiveness does not lie in the strength of our own willpower, but in grace and community and we access that through prayer.

## Mass Information During Time of Pandemic PLEASE

As COVID-19 is spiking, let us remember to care for one another by observing the pandemic restrictions.

1. Two-meter physical distancing is **obligatory** in the church, gathering space and parking lot.
2. When being seated kindly sit **singly** at the pre-measured number signs. If you notice 2 numbered signs together, please leave it for couples.
3. Masks are obligatory (if you cannot wear a mask for medical reasons please see Sister Maria).
4. Please be on time for Mass. This is to ensure that the Greeter can check you in by the time Mass begins.
5. The allowed number of Mass participants is 70.
6. If you would like to attend a weekend Mass, please contact the office no later than noon on Friday to add your name to the list of participants. If you have signed up but are unable to attend please contact the office before 4:00 p.m. Friday
7. There is no need to sign up beforehand for the weekday Masses; however, participants will have to sign their name to a list upon arrival.
8. For the purpose of contact tracing, if ever needed, please add your **phone number** or **email** next to your name.
