Living Witnesses to Jesus

"I am the Lord, and there is no other." Isiah 45.5

In today's Gospel, Jesus' enemies tried to trap him with a clever question about whether or not to pay taxes. Whichever answer he gave could lead to his ultimate downfall.

Despite the flattery with which they tried to ensnare Jesus, the Pharisees saw themselves as the religious elite to which he could never belong. The Pharisees and Herodians were not concerned about the legitimacy of taxation; they only wanted to trap him. In order to look sincere, they prefaced their question by flattering Jesus. But Jesus saw right through their plan and called them on it.

When we are hypocritical, we are putting on an act, saying one thing and then doing the opposite. But when our actions betray our words, we have to ask ourselves if we really believe what we say we do. It can be a painful process to search our consciences and discover ways in which our actions aren't lining up with our beliefs. But the Lord understands our struggles and will forgive us to help us to change.

Best of all, the more we are able to authentically live out our Christian beliefs, the more we can become living witnesses to Jesus – and the kingdom he has ushered in. "Jesus, help me to act on what I say I believe."

This weekend we celebrate World Mission Sunday. In the "Joy of the Gospel" Pope Francis challenges us to be missionary disciples. He says:

"All the baptized, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith, are agents of evangelization... The new evangelization calls for personal involvement on the part of each of the baptized...Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are 'disciples' and 'missionaries,' but rather that we are always 'missionary disciples."



Mass Information During Time of Pandemic PLEASE

As COVID-19 is spiking, let us remember to care for one another by observing the pandemic restrictions.

- 1. Two-meter physical distancing is **obligatory** in the church, gathering space and parking lot.
- 2. When being seated kindly sit **singly** at the pre-measured number signs. If you notice 2 numbered signs together, please leave it for couples.
- 3. Masks are obligatory (if you cannot wear a mask for medical reasons please see Sister Maria).
- 4. Please arrive at least 5-10 minutes before Mass. This is to ensure that the Greeter can check you in by the time Mass begins.
- 5. The allowed number of Mass participants is 70.
- 6. If you would like to attend a weekend Mass, please contact the office no later than noon on Friday to add your name to the list of participants. If you have signed up but are unable to attend please contact the office before 4:00 p.m. Friday
- 7. There is no need to sign up beforehand for the weekday Masses; however, participants will have to sign their name to a list upon arrival.
- 8. For the purpose of contact tracing, if ever needed, please add your **phone number** or **email** next to your name.
