Heart of a Child

At the end of today's Gospel, Jesus proclaims that whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.

When they are young, a child depends on its parents for everything. They trust their parents and are full of joy, love and innocence.

However, as one grows older we know that life is not always easy or fair and we lose our childlike innocence. We may find it harder to trust and depend on other people, and our hearts can become hardened.

Jesus is not asking us to ignore reality, but to not let the complexities and disappointments in this life caused by the reality of the human condition, take away our ability to have an open heart, to have faith and to love.

Just as a child loves, trusts and depends on their parents, we too are asked to love, trust and depend on God. Not out of blind obedience, but because as our loving father he wants what is best for us.

To encounter God we need to be open and trusting like a child. The child is fully receptive to love, and so we must be fully receptive of God's love and gift of salvation.

The Bishops of Canada Unequivocally Apologize to the Indigenous Peoples

The Catholic Bishops of Canada, gathered in Plenary this week, took the opportunity to affirm and acknowledge to the Indigenous Peoples the suffering experienced in Canada's Indian Residential Schools.

Many Catholic religious communities and dioceses participated in this system, which led to the suppression of Indigenous languages, culture and spirituality, failing to respect the rich history, traditions and wisdom of Indigenous Peoples.

Along with those Catholic entities which were directly involved in the operation of the schools and which have already offered their own heartfelt apologies, the Catholic Bishops of Canada expressed their profound remorse and apologized unequivocally.

Government of Manitoba Updated Pandemic Directives Effective October 5, 2021

Beginning Tuesday, October 5th, the new public orders will
permit indoor sizes for faith-based gatherings to 25 people
or 33 percent capacity, whichever is greater. This means
that our maximum limit with physical distancing in church
remains at approximately 80 people.

For funerals, weddings, and baptisms the number is reduced
to 25 people.

Masks must be worn in all indoor public places, including
places of worship and physical distancing of two metres for
everyone not living in the same household must be
maintained.

If you would like to attend a weekend Mass, please call or
email the office the week prior to book a space. We still
need to have a list of names and numbers of all those
attending for the purpose of contact tracing.
