The Feasts of All Saints and All Souls

This Monday, November 1st, is the Solemnity of All Saints. This day is dedicated to all those who have entered Heaven. This includes the saints recognized by the Church, and those known to God alone, especially our own beloved family and friends who have gone before us in faith.

On Tuesday, November 2nd, is the Feast of All Souls. This day is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached Heaven. This is a day to commemorate, remember and pray for the dead.

The feast days of All Saints and All Souls remind us of the interconnection of the Church Militant (the Church on Earth), the Church Suffering (the Church in Purgatory) and the Church Triumphant (the Church in Heaven).

God desires that all be with him in Heaven. As Christians, it is our goal to be with God in Heaven, but we also desire the same goal for others. We are all part of the Communion of Saints, praying with and for one another so that one day we all may be joined together as one body with our Heavenly Father in Heaven.



Government of Manitoba Updated Pandemic Directives Effective October 26, 2021

New provincial restrictions came into effect on October 26, 2021. There are no changes to the size of faith-based gatherings. The health orders permit indoor sizes for faith-based gatherings to 25 people or 33 percent capacity, whichever is greater. This means that our maximum limit with physical distancing in church remains at approximately 80 people.

Funerals, weddings, and baptisms are limited to 150 people or 50% of capacity, whichever is lower. In order to maintain social distancing in our church, approximately 80 people are permitted.

Please note that by decision of the Archdiocese, parishes will not require the faithful to present proof of vaccination.

Masks must be worn in all indoor public places, including places of worship and physical distancing of two metres for everyone not living in the same household must be maintained.

If you would like to attend a weekend Mass, please call or email the office the week prior to book a space. We still need to have a list of names and numbers of all those attending for the purpose of contact tracing.

Thank you for your patience and understanding.
Let us continue to pray for one another...and to stay safe
