This Sunday, September 25, is the World Day of Migrants and Refugees. Below is a portion of Pope Francis' Message for the 108th World Day of Migrants and Refugees 2022.

Building the Future with Migrants and Refugees

Dear brothers and sisters!

The ultimate meaning of our "journey" in this world is the search for our true homeland, the Kingdom of God inaugurated by Jesus Christ, which will find its full realization when he comes in glory. His Kingdom has not yet been brought to fulfilment, though it is already present in those who have accepted the salvation he offers us...

The city yet to come is a "city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God" His plan calls for an intense work of construction, in which all of us must be personally involved. It involves a meticulous effort aimed at personal conversion and the transformation of reality, so that it can correspond ever more fully to the divine plan. The tragedies of history remind us how far we are from arriving at our goal, the new Jerusalem.. Yet this does not mean that we should lose heart. In the light of what we have learned in the tribulations of recent times, we are called to renew our commitment to building a future that conforms ever more fully to God's plan of a world in which everyone can live in peace and dignity...

No one must be excluded. God's plan is essentially inclusive and gives priority to those living on the existential peripheries. Among them are many migrants and refugees, displaced persons, and victims of trafficking. The Kingdom of God is to be built with them, for without them it would not be the Kingdom that God wants. The inclusion of those most vulnerable is the necessary condition for full citizenship in God's Kingdom...

Building the future with migrants and refugees also means recognizing and valuing how much each of them can contribute to the process of construction...

Dear brothers and sisters, and, in a special way, young people! If we want to cooperate with our heavenly Father in building the future, let us do so together with our brothers and sisters who are migrants and refugees. Let us build the future today! For the future begins today and it begins with each of us. We cannot leave to future generations the burden of responsibility for decisions that need to be made now, so that God's plan for the world may be realized and his Kingdom of justice, fraternity, and peace may come.

Perogy Sale Fundraiser October 3 & 4, 2022

The perogy fundraiser will be taking place Monday, October 3, and Tuesday, October 4, 2022. We ask that those who had signed up to volunteer, to please see the perogy fundraiser table set-up in the gathering space to determine job allocations. The table will be set up after weekend Masses for the next two weekends. If you have not volunteered, but would like to, please see the perogy fundraiser table. Would all volunteers please remember to bring your aprons as it really helps to cut down on our laundry.

Orders will be taken after Mass for the next two weekends. Perogies are \$7 per dozen and the limit is 10 dozen. Orders must be picked up between 1 and 4 p.m. on Tuesday afternoon. Any orders not picked up by 4 p.m. will be sold.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day September 30, 2022

Both the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day take place on September 30. The day honours the lost children and Survivors of residential schools, their families and communities. Recognizing this day is important in the process of reconciliation.

Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day that honours the children who survived residential schools and remembers those who did not. Information on the origin of this day can be found at www.orangeshirtday.org.

On September 30, we encourage all parishioners to wear orange to raise awareness of the tragic legacy of residential schools, to honour Survivors and to promote relationships of friendship and deep respect.


